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
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

Number of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs (2000 - 2012)




Number of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs 1969 – 2012


Percentage of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs by Geographic Region




Distribution of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs by Accrediting Region











Mean Years as a Faculty Member




Years as FT Core Faculty Member





Sex of Faculty











Number of Programs that Have Minority Faculty by Number of Minority Faculty Per Program




Entry-level Degrees Held by Core Faculty 2011-2012




Highest Degree Held by Core Faculty 2011-2012
