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



# Number of Accredited PT Programs by Degree Offered 1979 - 1/2007




## Percentage of Accredited and Developing PT Programs by Geographic Region, 2000-2006


Percentage of Accredited and Developing PT Programs by Accrediting Region





## Distribution of Accredited and Developing PT Programs By Carnegie Classification and Degree Conferred in 2006




# Distribution of Accredited and Developing PT Programs By Type of Institution






#### 2004-05 Annual Tuition of MPT and DPT Programs (Mean and Range)







# Proportion of Contact Hours in Class/Lab and Clinical Education 2006-2007




# Proportion of Credit Hours in Class/Lab and Clinical Education 2004-2005







# Admission Trends: MPT Programs





# **Total Graduates from PT Programs** (**projected to 2007)











**Mean Years as a Core Faculty Member 2004-05** 





## Sex of PT Faculty AY 2004-05






Number of Programs That Have Minority Faculty by Number of Minority Faculty




## **Entry-level Degrees Held by Core Faculty 2004-05**









#### Rank of Core Faculty by Primary Responsibility 2006-07
