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
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
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# NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PTA PROGRAMS

## Number of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs (2000 - 2011)




## Number of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs 1969 – 2011


## Percentage of Accredited and Developing PTA Programs by Geographic Region














### Number of Core Faculty who are Certified Clinical Specialists:

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### Mean Years as a Faculty Member




### Years as FT Core Faculty Member





## Sex of Faculty








### Number of Programs that Have Minority Faculty by Number of Minority Faculty Per Program




## Entry-level Degrees Held by Core Faculty



## Highest Degree Held by Core Faculty




## Rank of Faculty by Primary Responsibility
