- Licensure pass rate information provided by the FSBPT on April 19, 2004, April 11, 2005, April 11, 2006 and April 18, 2007



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

1979 – 2007**




Percentage of Accredited and Developing PT Programs by Geographic Region, 2004-2007


Percentage of Accredited and Developing PT Programs by Accrediting Region





Distribution of Accredited and Developing PT Programs By Type of Institution








2007-08 Annual Tuition of MPT and DPT Programs (Mean and Range)











Admission Trends: MPT Programs




Admission Trends: DPT Programs











Mean Years as a Core Faculty Member 2007-08





Sex of PT Faculty AY 2007-08




Age of Core Faculty






**Number of Programs That Have Minority Faculty
by Number of Minority Faculty**




Entry-level Degrees Held by Core Faculty 2007-08




Highest Degree Held by Core Faculty 2007-08




Rank of Core Faculty by Primary Responsibility 2007-08




Tenure Status of Faculty 2007-08
